### **CHAPTER I**

# **INTRODUCTION**

This chapter contains six parts that will be discussed, starting from study background, problem statements, study objectives, originality and significance, study limitations, and definition of key terms.

## 1.1 Background of the Study

Day by day, during the phases of life, human will always show changes in term of their ability to express emotions or even react on something. Human development can be identified as the growth of human's physical, mental, and social activity over the entire life span (Kagan, Lerner & Bornstein, 2020). Those changes are related to anything that happens to each person's biological and social status. It can be the family, the workplace, school, and society in general. This theory builds perception of personality development as both individual and social phenomenon. Behavior is also influenced by every decision made by each person. Everyone has their own principles and needs in making any choice, starting from deciding what to eat, what to buy and other important decisions (Berger, 2016, p. 1).

This romance novel tells a story about the journey of the main character, Haruki Shiga, a quiet high school student who has difficulty in making friends. He always expects that his life will remain this way, which is living forever by his own without thinking about his surroundings. Haruki Shiga does not like meeting and talking to anyone until there comes a day when he accidentally meets a cheerful girl named Sakura Yamauchi, his classmate who was diagnosed with fatal pancreatic disease. Initially, Haruki Shiga tries to push Sakura Yamauchi away from him because he does not want to get involved in such social interaction. Time flies, many things happen and finally change his behavior and perception about life since he became closer to Sakura Yamauchi. She brings different atmosphere for Haruki Shiga and other people around her. Her personality creates a new journey for both of them (Sumino, 2015).

The title of this story was taken from the statement "I want to eat your pancreas" that was uttered by both Sakura Yamauchi and Haruki Shiga in two different scenes of the story. One day, Sakura Yamauchi tells a story about the myth saying that people with bad or unhealthy organ would be cured once they eat others' healthy organ. And it said that the soul of the death people would live in the one who eat the organ. This story is unique because it does not only focus on the love story between Haruki Shiga and Sakura Yamauchi. This story also shows an interesting side of Sakura Yamauchi, the female main character who behaves in a unique, fun, and unexpecting ways amidst her struggle battling with her deadly pancreatic disease. *I Want to Eat Your Pancreas* also has more than one adaptation form such as manga, anime, and live-action movie. The writer has watched the anime version and the story line was very interesting. Therefore, the writer wants to go deeper into the characterization and try to find the core issues of Sakura Yamauchi from the original version of this work, which is the novel. The writer will try to analyze the novel to find how the characteristic of Sakura Yamauchi is represented and leads to the core issues using other related literary theories applied.

# **1.2 Statements of the Problem**

## 1.3 Objectives of the Study

By doing this study, the writer wants to analyze the core issues of the female main character based on its original version of *I Want to Eat Your Pancreas*'s. The writer will analyze the journey of Sakura Yamauchi, as the female main character. By doing this analysis, the writer will find the characterization of Sakura Yamauchi, that will be continued further to identify her personality development and find the reasons or causes behind her attitude and decision with the help of Psychoanalysis theory. The finding supported by Psychoanalysis theory will help the writer to figure out the core issues of the Sakura Yamauchi by paying attention to her behavior throughout the story. 2. Psychoanalysis theory

A literary criticism established by Sigmund Freud with purpose to investigate the interaction of conscious and unconscious elements in the mind of human (Tyson, 1998).

3. Motives

The behavior that reflects the wants and desires of people to fulfill their needs or goals (Sharma, 2015).

4. Self-Defense Mechanism

Any behavior people use in order to separate themselves from unpleasant events, actions, or thought (Holland, 2019). It helps people to keep all the repressed feelings to avoid knowing something they cannot handle (Tyson, 1998, p. 15).
