

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

This chapter contains the background of the internship, objectives of the internship, scope of the report, scope of the report, significance, and operational definitions of key terms.

1.1 Background

In improving and building a better future. Many universities prepare quality students to enter the world of work. Therefore, to improve knowledge, skills, and experience, students are asked to be more active in the academic environment, such as the introduction that students can do to deepen their understanding of the subject matter, build practical skills, and develop experience in the academic community. One of the stages can be used in internship activities such as the planning stage which includes the formulation of learning outcomes starting with the definition of the graduate profile, the elaboration of the profile into competencies, the elaboration of competencies into learning outcomes. In addition, internships are very good for students to gain work experience and learn more about the work culture in the industry and can interact with new environments. However, the lack of

good management of internships will have a negative impact on students, partners, and universities.

Through the Merdeka Belajar Kampus Merdeka (MBKM) Program launched by the Minister of Education and Culture, which aims to encourage students to be able to master various sciences to prepare for entering the world of work. Which is written in the Minister of Education and Culture regulation No. 3 of 2020, which gives students the right to study outside their study program for one semester and carry out activities outside the university for 2 semesters.
