### **CHAPTER 2**

## 2.1 The General Description of the School

Most countries have a formal education system that is generally compulsory. In this system, students' progress through a series of teaching and learning activities at school. Today, the word school has changed its meaning to a building or institution for learning and teaching as well as a place to receive and give lessons. not only learning, but schools can also be a place to play, meet new people, and a place to explore students' desires. one of them is MI Wahid Hasyim school.

MI Wahid Hasyim is an Islamic school-based school located in Turi village, Dau subdistrict, Malang district. Far from the city center, this school teaches 430 students in 17 classes from grade 1 to grade 6 from various parts of the village. why? because the distance is close and can be reached in several areas, making the school the only one in the area. MI Wahid Hasyim has 3 buildings. 1 building has 3 floors, the first floor has the teacher's office and 4 classes, the second floor has 6 classes from 3 different grades, namely grade 2 grade 3 and grade, 4 and on the third floor there are 5 classes from 2 different grades, namely grade 6 and grade 4. for grade 5 has a separate building from other classes. the last building is a mosque that is used by students for recitation and prayer.

Their entry schedule starts at 6.45 for ceremonies, prayer, and recitation, then go home at 1 pm every day. Sometimes, they can go home early if the village holds an event which is usually attended by all residents, including children. The school has also prepared minibus facilities to take home students whose homes are in other villages.

My internship assignment while at MI Wahid Hasyim was to teach students in grades 3 to 6 English according to the agreement between teachers and lecturers because there was a lack of teachers to teach English. Not only teaching, but the tasks also that my friends and I got were writing exam questions and giving homework, then don't forget to correct their homework.



#### 2.3 The Problem

Although it is famous for its Islamic school, MI Wahid Hasyim still has some shortcomings which according to the author still needs a lot of guidance and direction, both for teachers and students. such as:

### 2.3.1 Lack of Manners

One of the basic moral values that must be possessed by humans is the character of good manners. Manners reflect personality and noble character obtained through experience, education, and examples from parents, teachers, religious leaders, and

community leaders. Good manners are also a reflection of morals that can be achieved through education at home and the learning process of children at school. Knowledge transfer measured by grades has not been able to form a person with noble character. Good manners depend on the process of fostering children's morals, so that morals will always be attached and appear in the form of actions. When first visiting MI Wahid Hasyim, there were some students who mentioned the word "chindo" to the author and colleagues. During teaching, there were still many students who did not respect the author and colleagues as a substitute for their teachers. some were acting up, talking to their classmates, not listening to what the author said, considering homework as trivial, and a style of speaking that considered the author as their friend.

### 2.3.2 Irresponsible Teachers

According to UURI NO. 14 of 2005 "is a professional educator with the main task of educating, teaching, guiding, directing, training, assessing, and evaluating students in early childhood education in formal education, primary education, and secondary education." However, there are still teachers who do not apply what teachers should do for their students. This happened during the first meeting when the author was given the opportunity to see how the teacher worked. At the beginning of class, the teacher seemed to explain the material that students would learn and then provide practice questions. However, during the inspection, the author saw that the results that the students had worked on were not checked properly. in other words, "justifying" all the student's work.

### 2.3.3 Negative Impact of The Use of Social Media

The development of Information Technology is a tangible result of the development of human knowledge that can provide changes in the pattern of human life today. With the development of today's gadgets, social media has kept up with the rapid pace of technology in the current era. However, behind its benefits, social media also has dangers that you need to be aware of. Addiction and excessive use can interfere with activities and mental health. Cyberbullying and online harassment can cause trauma and psychological wounds. The spread of misinformation and hoaxes

can mislead and confuse users. The privacy and security of personal data is also at stake, with the risk of misuse always lurking. Mental health disorders such as anxiety and depression can also arise due to unhealthy use of social media. What the author experienced while carrying out his internship was the use of impolite words when talking to the author, inappropriate pictures that the author often finds in student books and even in public seating.
