CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1. Background

a) Translation

According to Yinhua (2011), equivalence in translation refers to a concept of similarity or approximation, not a quest for sameness of two meanings shared between two languages: the target language and the source language.

c) Naturalness

According to Danbaba (2017), naturalness in translation is an element that contributes to a good translation. It refers to the state in which the translation does not sound foreign in the target language as it mainly aims to convey a message in a manner that the audience can readily understand.
