A small percentage of parents do, however, have differing views on the matter. These differing viewpoints are affected by a variety of elements, such as the parents' particular circumstances, background in culture, and personal views. The objectives that parents have for their children influence how they view the importance of early language acquisition. Parents' perspectives on learning a foreign language are varied and diverse. Each parent has their own set of values, beliefs, and considerations that shape their stance on this topic.
